

## Pupil Premium

Pupil Premium is allocated to all schools where there are children who are entitled to free school meals, are looked after by the Local Authority or who have parents who are in the Armed Forces.

The Pupil Premium is additional funding given to schools for pupils who have been registered for free school meals at any point in the last six years so that they can support these pupils and close the attainment gap between them and their peers. From September 2012, schools have been required to publish information about how they have used their Pupil Premium allocation. At Bishop Pursglove C of E we have carefully spent and monitored this funding and ensured that there is a whole school focus on ensuring that there is no gap in attainment and achievement.

Pupil premium funding is based on the number of children eligible for free school meals as recorded in the January census and those children who have been eligible during the last 6 years (known as ever 6). Children who attract pupil premium funding may start or leave the school at any time during the year, therefore the number of pupil premium children at any one time may not correspond with the funding received. We currently have 9 children who qualify for Pupil Premium funding. We provide support and resources for these children throughout the year and as their needs vary they may be changes to the planned expenditure.

### **Evaluation of previous year's impact**

Last year, the school received £16420 in Pupil Premium funding. Money in 2017/2018 was primarily spent on providing extra TA support to enable individualised learning. This has been allocated to pay for additional Teaching Assistant hours to deliver targeted interventions such as: Rapid Maths, IDL and a Nurture Group. The majority of pupils made at least good progress in these interventions.

### **Focus for 2018 – 2019**

Analysis of data showed that extra support needs to be provided to support reading comprehension, problem solving and reasoning in Maths and the teaching of writing in KS2 for PP children. Additional reading comprehension materials will be purchased. An on line dyslexia programme (IDL) has been purchased). Money is also being used to support small group intervention in maths where tracking shows that intervention is needed to ensure that good progress is being made.

In KS1/2 – The funding supports the Nurture group which will continue. This group supports pupils who need to develop and embed PSED skills. Funding supports extra phonics groups and 1 to 1 /small group intervention in KS1.

We will continue our focus on ensuring that there is no gap in attainment and achievement between our Pupil Premium pupils and their peers and ensure that enrichment activities are available to all.

How well do the children receiving Pupil Premium do at Bishop Pursglove CE Primary school?

The progress of these children is carefully tracked and reported, anonymously, to the Governing Body. Due to the very small numbers of pupils receiving Pupil Premium this data is not available on our website to ensure that the progress of individual pupils cannot be identified.
